•will make recommendations as a result of the fatality reviews, and


•will increase the coordination and communication among systems and agencies involved in DV issues.







Age of Offender at time of homicide





Age of Victim at time of homicide






Cause of Death

OF THE 24 FATALITIES, 9 OCCURRED WHILE CHILDREN WERE IN THE HOME.




In total, there were 15 children present, in the residence, at the time of the homicides.



FACT

About 21% of the offenders had alcohol and/or drugs in their systems at the time of the homicide.





IMPACT OF REVIEWS

- a. Unified DV Court
- b. Cross Jurisdictional Communication
 - Domestic Relations Judges now review the record on cases where emergency motions or agreed entries are filed to look at the history
 - Sheriff to share his information on criminal case histories on booking so that all information is available at time of bond hearing and sentencing
- c. Akron Police Department 911 Priority
- d. CBCF Recognition of Protection Orders
- e. General Education and Community Workshops
- f. CSB: Internal Fatherhood Initiative
- g. Know Your Date Project
